



Leaders for Democracy Fellowship Program



PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The U.S. Department of State's U.S.- Middle East Partnership Initiative (MEPI), and the international non-profit organization, World Learning, are pleased to announce a call for applications for the twelfth year of the Leaders for Democracy Fellowship (LDF) programs. These programs provide emerging and mid-career leaders from the Middle East and North Africa with the opportunity to complete an intensive specialized academic training at either Duke University in English or the American University of Beirut in Arabic and gain relevant professional experience within a practicum host organization in Washington, D.C. or Beirut. This Fellowship will cover the cost of international and domestic travel, health insurance and housing and provide a modest living stipend to cover meals and incidentals.

The LDF program is open to applicants between the ages of 25 and 35 with a minimum of a bachelor's degree and sufficient English or Arabic language fluency to successfully function in an English or Arabic language university and professional working environment. Applicants also should have at least five years of professional work experience and both the capacity and commitment to apply the experience gained through the Fellowship in developing and implementing a project that will benefit an organization, specific community and/or sector in their home countries. The Lebanon Fellowship will run from July 14, 2018 through October 6, 2018 and the U.S. Fellowship will run from July 28, 2018 through October 20, 2018. Fellows are expected to travel to the United States or Lebanon unaccompanied by family or friends.

Program Objective

Advance governance and empower civil society leaders by providing academic learning and practicum experience, as well as support and reinforce alumni linkages with counterparts across the region.

Program Activities

- ✓ Four week academic learning
- ✓ Eight week practicum
- ✓ Post-program engagement

To promote program sustainability and create a multiplier effect, participants will create and implement follow-on projects in their home communities. Follow-on projects may include a new idea or improving an existing idea already being implemented in the community. Action plans for the follow-on projects will be developed and finalized throughout the course of the program.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- a) Be between 25 and 35 years of age;
- b) Have at least a bachelor's degree and the demonstrated ability to succeed in a demanding and intensive academic environment;
- c) Have strong English or Arabic language fluency sufficient to function successfully in a high-level academic as well as professional environment;
- d) Have at least five years of professional work experience.
